

Find Someone Who... *Template*

Directions to teacher

1. Complete each box in the grid with a different sentence that can be completed by filling in the preceding blank with a student's name. For example: _____ **knows what a 'hurricane' is.**
2. Photocopy one completed grid for each student.
3. Distribute the grids. Ask students to silently read over each statement. Tell students to put a '✓' beside the statements that they know. Put a '?' beside those that they are unsure about. Put an 'X' beside those that they don't know at all.
4. Ask students to stand up and walk around the class, asking other students questions made from the statements in the boxes. For example: **"Do you know what a hurricane is?"**

If the student being asked can answer the question, he/she can sign in the appropriate blank on the grid of the student who asked the question.

If the student being asked doesn't know the correct answer, he or she may be asked another question.

Note: *Each student can sign another's grid once only.*

5. As soon as each student has all (or a required number) of the squares on his/her grid signed off, he/she may sit down.
6. When all students have had a chance to finish the activity, ask the class questions based on the information in the boxes. For example: **"Who knows what a hurricane is?"** Students who found someone who knew the answer to the question can put up a hand to volunteer that person's name. You may then ask that student to answer the question.
