1. Silently read over the questions in the boxes below. Put a '✓' beside the questions that you can answer. Put a '?' beside those that you are unsure about. Put an X beside those that you don't know at all.
2. When your teacher tells you to start, walk around the class, asking other students questions from the boxes. For example, you might ask *"Can you name Canada's Prime Minister?"*
3. If the student that you ask doesn't know the correct answer, ask him or her another question, or find someone else to ask. If the student gives you an answer that you think is correct, ask for his/her signature on the line above the question. *Note: You may ask each person to sign your sheet once only.*
4. As soon as you have all of the squares signed off (or the number that your teacher asked you to complete), you are finished and may return to your seat.
5. When all students have had a chance to finish the activity, your teacher will ask the class questions based on the information in the boxes, such as *"Who knows the name of Canada's Prime Minister?"* If you found someone who knew the answer to the question asked, put up your hand to volunteer that person's name. Your teacher may then ask that student to answer the question.
